

Role of General Practice teams in supporting patient access to treatments for COVID-19

- Some people at highest risk of becoming seriously ill from COVID-19 are eligible for antiviral treatments on the NHS.
- These include some patients with cancer, blood conditions, kidney disease, liver disease and autoimmune conditions, among others.
- GP reception staff must arrange **an appointment with the clinical team** if a patient calls and says they are eligible for these treatments, have tested positive for COVID-19 and have not been contacted about treatment.

The process is as follows:



Please <u>do not</u> refer patients to 119 for assessment or treatment - referrals to a CMDU must be done by a GP team. 119 teams provide patients with lateral flow tests and help them to record test results.
